Reading the lies, misinformation, and conspiracy theories printed by well-respected news sources has been a painful experience for our staff and Board who know intimately the quality, professionalism, and care we grant each and every client.

The points below serve as a reference to the excellent standards of care AlphaCare upholds in service to pregnant women, new mothers, and their families in Philadelphia.



- **Registered nurses** who hold, at minimum, a bachelor's degree and state nursing licensure. Two of our nurses have also earned master's degrees in nursing.
- Two staff physicians who volunteer their expertise. Our Medical Director oversees all our medical policies and procedures, and our licensed radiologist reviews each client's ultrasound.
- Limited obstetric sonography training in keeping with AWHONN (Association of Women's Health, Obstetric, and Neonatal Nurses) standards.
- Licensure as a clinical lab for conducting pregnancy tests in office and on the Mobile Medical Unit.



- Educated and experienced every person on our team holds a degree in a field related to social services and/or more than 10 years of experience in their professional field.
- Informed all team members receive Mental Health First Aid training and training through the Trauma Healing Institute to ensure they are equipped to address clients with compassion, empathy, and a proven, professional methodology. All new team members shadow experienced staff on best practices in identifying and addressing obstacles and opportunities with clients.
- **Connected** staff partner with community agencies and refer clients to these resources to provide holistic care and support.

Privacy & Confidentiality

- AlphaCare complies with HIPAA in maintaining confidentiality.
- Individual health information is always kept secure, and access is limited to personnel who have reasonable need to use such information in their care.
- All staff and volunteers sign a confidentiality agreement and receive training on the policy and procedures protecting patient health information.
- All clients are informed of the protections to their health information.
- Written authorization is obtained from each client for any use or disclosure of their health information. Most often this authorization is received to send appointment information to a client's OB/GYN for ongoing care.
